SUPPORT OF FAMILIES WITH SMALL CHILDREN IN SLOVAKIA

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Background

- Very low fertility level in Slovakia since beginning of the 90s of the 20th century
- Current families changes in form and structure
 - less complete families
 - more cohabitations, sinle-parent families and one-person households
 - smaller families (less children, less multigenerational families)
- The society needs stable families and more children in families
- Support of families in Slovakia wide disparity between theory and practice

Theory

- Public opinion European Values Study (2008)
 - Marriage or long term relationship are important (78.5% agree or tend to agree)
 - Children are important (80,5% very important, 17,1% rather important)

Programs of political parties

All relevant political parties declare the need to support families

Governmental materials

 Conceptual and strategic materials – 4 main areas of family support – financial support, reconciliation of work and family, housing, stability of families

- How the four main groups of measures contained in national strategic documents are implemented in practice?


Financial support of families with children

- Financial assistance
 - birth allowance (once 829,- EUR, 151,- EUR 4+ children)
 - maternity allowance (during maternity leave, 70% of gross income, max. 26,42 EUR per day)
 - parental allowance (during parental leave, monthly 203,- EUR personal care, max 230,- EUR working parent, child in a childcare facility)
 - child allowance (monthly 23,50 EUR, dependent child max. 25 years)
- Allowance for a child in alternative care (monthly 138,- EUR per dependent child, 175,- EUR for parents)
- Tax bonus (monthly 21,41 EUR per child, only working parents)

Reconciliation of work and family


- Childcare facilities for pre-school children
 - lack of capacity unfavourable tendency decrease of kindergartens and increase of live births
 - 87% coverage children 4-6 years, 6% of applications rejected because of lack of capacity, regional differences
- Motivation of employers to willingness to families with children
 - mainly part-time work and flexible working time arrangements
- Leaves
 - maternity leave (min. 14 weeks, max. 34 weeks)
 - parental leave (max. until 3 years of child age)
- Services for families

Number of kindergartens per 1000 live births




Rejected applications

(due to the lack of capacities in kindergartens)




Part-time jobs



Housing

- Lack of affordable flats for young families (especially in cities)
- Small number of rental flats (3% of housing stock, less than 10% of population)
- Tradition of home ownership in Slovakia
- Rental flats are generally considered as a solution for socially disadvantaged families


Population by tenure status - tenants

- Less marriages, more cohabitations
- Increase of age at marriage
- Increase of divorce rate

Conclusions

- There is no a comprehensive and long-term stable system of measures to support families with children in Slovakia focused also to fertility increase
- Most of the efforts of government are focused on better reconciliation of work and family life
- Financial support and housing small state activity, concerns about abuse with particular regard to the Roma population
